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Consultation Matters

1.1 Letter from the Ontario Pipeline Landowners Association (OPLA)

Preamble:

Reference i) indicates that all potentially affected landowners and/or tenants have been consulted and there are no outstanding concerns.

Reference ii) indicates that OPLA members may not have been notified of this Application. It further indicates that OPLA has concerns regarding increasing pressure in Line 7.

Reference iii) requires an Application to describe the outcomes of the consultation program conducted for the project, including: the measures taken, or that will be taken, to address concerns expressed by potentially affected persons or groups or an explanation of why no further action is required to address the concerns.

Request:

- a) Please provide a response to the OPLA's submission that its members may not have been notified of Enbridge's Application.
- b) Please describe the measures taken, or that will be taken, by Enbridge to address the OPLA's concerns regarding increasing pressure in Line 7, or provide an explanation as to why no further action is required to address this concern.

Please provide the following:

- a) A description of the consultation activities that have occurred with the Haudenosaunee Development Institute and the Métis Nation of Ontario regarding the Project; or,
- b) An explanation why consultation with these Aboriginal groups was considered unnecessary.
